The programme sought to equip students at the **10+2 and undergraduate levels** with clear understanding of career opportunities, entry mechanisms, preparation strategies, and professional ethics required to serve in national security agencies, public service commissions, and global organizations. With the participation of **148 students and young aspirants**, the event reflected growing interest among Nepali youth in disciplined, service-oriented professions.

Six eminent speakers with distinguished professional experience addressed the gathering. **Former Major General Raghu Bhandari** and **Honorary Major General Ratna Godhar** delivered detailed presentations on the **Nepali Army**, explaining recruitment processes, training systems, career progression, and the broader role of the Army in national security, disaster response, and international peacekeeping. Their remarks emphasised leadership, integrity, and commitment to national duty.



**Former Armed Police Force Inspector General Pushparam KC** shared insights into career opportunities within the **APF Nepal**, highlighting its responsibilities in border security, disaster management, and internal security, as well as the importance of discipline and resilience. Likewise, **Former Deputy Inspector General Kesh Bahadur Shahi** spoke on career pathways in the **Nepal Police**, focusing on law enforcement, public trust, and professional growth within the policing system.

The scope and significance of service in the **National Investigation Department (NID)** were outlined by **Investigation Director Laxman Gurung**, who shed light on the critical role of intelligence in safeguarding national interests. Additionally, **Former Colonel Direndra Malla** elaborated on career opportunities within the **United Nations**, particularly in peacekeeping and international service, encouraging youth to aspire to global roles that uphold Nepal's reputation abroad.

A special feature of the programme was the contribution of **Former Brigadier General Ram Chandra Khatri**, Sukeerti Padak recipient, former Military Attaché of Nepal to India, Sri Lanka and Maldives (2021-2024), Managing Director of Eagle Think Tank, and author of *Strategic Affairs Capsule*, *Current Affairs Capsule* and *Cadet Capsule*. He gifted copies of two books (*Strategic Affairs Capsule* and *Current Affairs Capsule*) to all participants, underlining the importance of continuous learning, strategic awareness, and current affairs knowledge for aspirants preparing for competitive service careers.
